After seeing a beautiful small blue-feathered bird recently, snacking on the fallen berries of a Chinese Pistache tree, I wondered how I could attract such creatures to my backyard. In addition to fresh water and habitat, of course I need to consider food sources. Because I don't care for feeders, I am considering toyon or dogwood for berries, western redbud for flowers and seedpods, and yarrow that attracts tasty insects. So, what was that bird I saw? After consulting my Field Guide to Western Birds, I'm thinking a Western Bluebird (a type of thrush) or Lazuli Bunting (a finch). Happy birding!
