Have you planted your summer vegetable garden? Full sun in my garden is limited, so I put in only a couple of tomato transplants and some herbs. Check the ground first and then wait until early evening or morning to water if necessary. Pick ripe vegetables and herbs early in the day for best flavor. Hopefully, I will be able to harvest them before my dog does!
